## Do you have other automotive products to recycle?

### Hazardous materials

- ◆ Car batteries
- ◆ Brake fluid
- ◆ Gasoline
- ◆ Flares
- ◆ Carburetor cleaner
- ◆ Engine degreaser
- ◆ Antifreeze
- ◆ Transmission fluid

### Non-hazardous materials

- ◆ Tires
- ◆ Vehicle parts

### Why recycle motor oil and filters?

- ◆ Oil is a valuable energy resource and two gallons of used motor oil can generate enough electricity for an average home for one day.
- ◆ One gallon of oil can contaminate one million gallons of fresh water (about a year's supply of water for 50 people).
- ◆ Oil filters are made of steel, which is highly recyclable.
- ◆ Recycling all oil filters sold in the US each year would produce 160,000 tons of steel (enough for 15 Safeco Field roofs).
